We have some pictures that we would like to show you...


Think about the images and give us your thoughts about them.


What are your thoughts and feelings about this picture?

- A negative impact on relationships and communication.
- A detrimental effect on peoples perception and opinion of you.
- Change in peoples behaviour towards you.
- Respectful treatment can aid in developing healthy relationships





What is happening in this picture?





- If you approach a lone woman even if it's only to help her. Your help could be misinterpreted and the woman could be scared and feel threatened.
- The local community may witness this behaviour and perceive it as a risk.
- The young woman may report you or call the Police.

- It is socially unacceptable to stare at people to look at their body - especially in places such as swimming pool.
- To do so could make another person feel uncomfortable and vulnerable.

 It is against the law to touch another person without their permission.











Girl feels intimidated

- Family could be protective
- Result in violence you could be in danger
- Harassment charge
- Police involved

- Inappropriate behaviour (including touching and groping) due to intoxication.
- Witnessed by the local community could cause anger and aggressive behaviour
- All could result in a criminal offence
